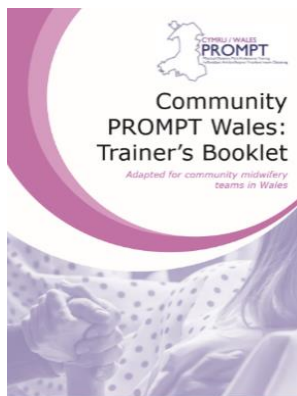


PROMPT WALES Local Development Days

PROMPT Wales Local Development days aka Train The Trainers have been well underway with dates so far held at Cwm Taf Morgannwg, Betsi Cadwaladr, Aneurin Bevan and Swansea Bay UHB with a total of 57 new PROMPT Wales faculty adding to the PROMPT Wales army. Future dates are still in the planning process for Hywel Dda, Cardiff & Vale and Powys THB. We look forward to supporting you on your dates.



Community PROMPT Wales update



The PROMPT Wales National Team have been evaluating the Community PROMPT Wales pilot. Community PROMPT Wales launched with a Train the Trainer event in November 2019 and has been piloted in all health boards throughout 2020. The training booklet has now been updated in line with current guidance as well as extras including programme samples.

Snapshot of the Survey Results: An online survey was completed by delegates who had attended a Community PROMPT Wales training course in 2020. 96% found the course to be excellent or very good with an increase in confidence levels after completing the training.



Recommendations:

- Training should be multi-professional with paramedics invited.
- Over half of community midwives felt they should attend both Community PROMPT Wales training as well as PROMPT training in their local maternity unit.

A report of the pilot will be shared with local health boards in the coming months.

To celebrate the implementation of Community PROMPT Wales training, we look forward to a holding an event this summer for all Community PROMPT Wales facilitators.

A second Train the Trainer event will be planned for the summer.



PROMPT Wales Leads Event



Following on from the success of the first PROMPT Wales Leads event at the Clayton Hotel, Cardiff last February, we are planning another annual get together via the virtual world of Teams.

Last year's event allowed each PROMPT Wales lead from all health boards across Wales to network and share learning including their success stories and discuss trouble-shooting issues.

We aim to hold the event this May and an invitation will be sent to PROMPT Wales leads.

COVID-secure PROMPT Wales training



Following agreement by Welsh Government, Welsh Risk Pool & Heads of Midwifery, health boards across Wales have continued to provide adapted face-to-face PROMPT Wales practical training, demonstrating a true commitment to keeping mothers and babies safe through multi-professional training. Local training days have been held in a variety of venues, from field hospitals to hotels to enabling social distancing. The national team have continued to attend courses and have been impressed by the dedication of teams who have organised and facilitated training during these challenging times. Safety has been maintained by smaller groups and strict adherence to PPE.
