The PROMPT WALES National Train the Trainer!!












Community PROMPT Wales update



Community PROMPT Wales has been fully implemented and mandated since September. The PROMPT Wales team have been supporting local days and it's been exciting to see the training package flourish with over 50 courses planned for 2021/23. Behind the scenes the PWNT are now working on some of the recommendations of the CPW report. One recommendation was further collaboration with WAST. The team are in the process of planning a bespoke Train the Trainer course for paramedics in January to enhance the multi-professional faculty and further the collaboration with paramedics to facilitate on CPW.
