

# PROMPT WALES TRAINING IS BACK!!

During the COVID pandemic, PROMPT Wales training was suspended from March so efforts could be concentrated on essential services, and for the safety and wellbeing of staff. Through the exceptional efforts of local faculties, a COVID-secure PROMPT Wales training programme has recommenced across Wales since September, with a focus of re-establishing >95% compliance by August 2021. The PROMPT Wales National Team have had the pleasure of attending and it has been interesting to see how each health board have adapted to the changes. Training has taken place socially distanced in academic centres, field hospitals and even hotels! Practical training is supported by virtual learning tools prepared by PROMPT Wales and local leads. Despite the adaptations, the PROMPT ethos is still evident throughout – teams who work together, train together!

# Community PROMPT Wales update



As 2020 is coming to a close, the PROMPT Wales National Team will be evaluating the Community PROMPT Wales pilot. Community PROMPT Wales launched with a Train the Trainer event in November 2019 and has been piloted in all health boards throughout 2020. To assist with the evaluation, we will be sending out an iSurvey link to community staff who have attended a local CPW course by the end of December. The questionnaire will aim to establish overall views of the training provided. Feedback from staff and faculty will help the team to finalise the programme and amend the training resources in accordance with recommendations made. There have been 33 CPW training events held so far across Wales which have been very well evaluated by the midwives, HCAs and paramedics who have attended.

# PROMPT WALES NATIONAL Train the Trainer Event NOW to be LOCAL TTT

The **PROMPT Wales Train the Trainer** was due to take place on 26<sup>th</sup> March but was postponed due to the restrictions resulting from the Coronavirus pandemic. It is with great pleasure that the PROMPT Wales National Team can now announce that the decision has been made to hold local Train the Trainer events at each health board. The National Team are in talks with health boards arranging dates, venues and faculty. Local TTT dates will be taking place end of December and into

the new year - 2021.





# Implementing PROMPT Wales

A report celebrating the success of NHS Wales in implementing PROMPT Wales has just been published. We now need to build on this, continuing to learn and make improvements as we aspire to our aim of making childbirth safer for women and babies. #### Here are some key points for the period 1/1/19 - 31/3/20:

- 141 PROMPT Wales courses were held
- A fantastic 2,710 staff attended PROMPT Wales training
- 94% midwives, 90% obstetric doctors, 86% anaesthetists & 77% HCAs attended throughout Wales
- There are 326 active PROMPT Wales facilitators coordinating and supporting PROMPT Wales training
