HAPPY 2020 EVERYONE!

2019 was a very busy year for the PROMPT Wales National team & for local health boards implementing PROMPT Wales. Here are some achievements so far:

- 107 PROMPT Wales courses were held 93% attendance by the PROMPT Wales National team
- 7 Local & 1 National Train the Trainer Events were hosted by the National team
- The PROMPT Wales National faculty database boasts 332 active facilitators which includes 49 community facilitators, 10 university lecturers and 6 WAST paramedics.
- The Community PROMPT Wales programme and training booklet was developed and launched at a Train the Trainer event on 8th November

2020 plans so far:

- Maternity units across Wales have 119 PROMPT Wales courses planned
- A PROMPT Wales National Leads networking event took place in February
- There are 39 Community PROMPT Wales courses planned so far
- A PROMPT Wales National Train the Trainer event is taking place at the end of March

Community PROMPT Wales is well underway with 39 courses planned so

far, with many locations ranging from midwives houses to freestanding birth centres! Cardiff & Vale UHB & BCUHB both held their first days on the 10th February.

The PROMPT Wales national team will be available to offer ongoing support by attending these days. As this is a pilot programme, each team have been asked to complete a feedback sheet following each training day which will be evaluated at the end of the year.
