We also reflect on the recent ISO Success of NWSSP Procurement Services that achieved successful outcomes of the STS Food Safety Audit in Bridgend, closely followed by Cwmbran and Denbigh. The conclusion of the external audit programme will allow NWSSP Procurement Teams to review all findings in line with our Business Planning framework and to identify and prioritise those areas where we can make improvements and add value to the teams and, ultimately, make the service the best we can for our customers.

Finally, our staff are our most valuable asset and I have seen many examples of real achievements over the past few months. In this edition, we celebrate the success of NWSSP employees including NWSSP – Legal and Risk Services Employment Law Solicitor Daniela Mahapatra who recently won Solicitor of the Year at the inaugural South Wales Law Awards and Mared Roberts, Translator in the NWSSP Welsh Language Unit, on winning the Drama Medal at the Urdd Eisteddfod, Cardiff and Vale of Glamorgan 2019.

Lead Medical Examiner for Wales Appointment Announced



NWSSP is pleased to announce that Dr Jason Shannon has been appointed to the role of Lead Medical Examiner for Wales. Dr Shannon will oversee the Wales Medical Examiner Service that will scrutinise all those deaths across a local area that do not fall under a Coroner's jurisdiction.

Hosted by NWSSP, the Lead Medical Examiner role will provide leadership and guidance to ensure that the Medical Examiner Service is established and governed effectively, providing advice where necessary on the configuration of local systems, whilst offering leadership and support to Medical Examiners across Wales.

Graduating from Birmingham Medical School with a BSC in Pathology in 1996, Dr Shannon has a long and diverse history within the medical profession.

He began his Pathology career as a Senior House Officer (SHO) in Bristol before moving to the Wales Deanery in 1998 to begin specialty training.

In 2003, Dr Shannon was appointed Consultant Pathologist in Cwm Taf Health University Board, becoming Clinical Director for Pathology in 2007.

In 2012, Dr Shannon became the Health Board's Assistant Medical Director for Service Strategy, which also saw him establish the Mortality Review Programme before undertaking the role of National Clinical Lead for Mortality Review in Wales in 2013.

In 2017, Dr Shannon was tasked with assisting Welsh Government with the implementation of the Medical Examiner System.

"I am delighted that Dr Jason Shannon has been appointed as the first Lead Medical Examiner for Wales. In a career that has spanned over 25 years, Dr Shannon is respected throughout the medical profession and his leadership, drive and passion will be instrumental in taking the Medical Examiner Service forward."

His appointment further illustrates Welsh Government's commitment to investment in our National Health Service and is an important step in ensuring that we have the best healthcare system in the world, delivering on commitments to improve patient safety and reduce harm."

On the confirmation of his appointment Dr Shannon said;

"It is privilege and honour to be appointed as the first ever Lead Medical Examiner for Wales. This is an important role in which I plan to use my medical experience to progress the implementation of the Medical Examiner service applicable to both England and Wales. I will be working closely with the National Medical Examiner, Dr Alan Fletcher, as well as my counterparts in English regions."

Here in Wales, we now have the opportunity to shape the service within NHS Wales Shared Services Partnership to create a Welsh service which is truly independent and founded on the principle of putting bereaved families at the forefront of the process of death review and certification for the purposes of public reassurance and healthcare learning."




What is the Medical Examiner Service?

The Medical Examiner Service is hosted by NWSSP. The Medical Examiner Service will scrutinise all deaths across a local area which do not fall under the Coroner's jurisdiction.


Independent Medical Examiners will improve the way NHS Wales investigations are carried out, providing bereaved families with full and honest answers and enabling the NHS in Wales to continually improve.

Supply Chain Excellence in Food Safety

Once again, it is congratulations to the Supply Chain Team at Denbigh Stores for retaining the STS Food Safety Standard Accreditation. 1 September 2018 saw the launch of the new STS Food Safety Standard for Food Suppliers and Distributors which supersedes the previous Public Sector Code of Practice whilst retaining all the key elements. It has now been expanded to include distribution, requirements such as TACCP (Threat Assessment Critical Control Point) and additional product authenticity controls.

On the 7 May 2019, an external auditor attended the Denbigh Regional Stores site in North Wales to complete the audit under the new standard. It is pleasing to report that no non-conformances were raised during the Audit. Retaining the STS certification helps demonstrate to our service users that we have robust food safety standards in place for the storage and distribution of stable ambient foods.

Mike Burns, Regional Supply Chain Manager for North & Mid Wales:

"This was an excellent result, and the whole team at Denbigh should be congratulated for their hard work and the continued effort in retaining the accreditation." Mike went on to say, "...that the excellent support received from Kirstie King (NWSSP Business Quality Manager) on the day of the audit ensured that the audit went smoothly on the day."



Supply Chain Reduce Carbon Footprint

Supply Chain is committed to managing their environmental impact, reducing their carbon footprint and increasing their sustainability. As a direct output of a recent review of the Denbigh Regional Stores, North West Wales Daily Transport Schedule, an opportunity to reduce the carbon footprint and operational costs was identified.

The Supply Chain function based at Denbigh Regional Stores has recently taken delivery of a new heavy goods vehicle, a Mercedes-Benz Atego 18T with a box length of approx. 30ft. This is an increase of approx. 8ft when compared to the standard current Procurement Services HGV (Mercedes-Benz Atego 15T).

This has allowed Denbigh Stores to maximise the vehicle payload capacity by allowing up to 8 additional roll cages to be transported, thus reducing the need to send a second vehicle on the North West Wales transport run.

This vehicle with the larger payload capacity will deliver the following benefits;

- Reduce fuel costs and increase operational service efficiencies, no 'mop up' delivery required
- Improve customer satisfaction; Gwynedd Hospital receives a complete delivery in one drop rather than having to wait for their second delivery

- Reduce CO₂ emissions, contributing to achieving the NWSSP Environment Objective "To reduce our carbon footprint and our contribution to climate change. (TARGET: 3% year-on-year reduction of carbon emissions generated at sites (baseline established 2016-17)."

Procurement Services: Celebrating ISO Success

The ISO Audit Season has well and truly “ramped up” in the last few months for Procurement Services, with a number of departments taking part in extension to scope and recertification audits.

Kicking off the external audits, we had successful review of our STS Food Safety Audit in Bridgend, closely followed by Cwmbran and Denbigh – who managed to get a clean sheet with no findings!

The Accounts Payable North Wales team based in Alder House followed closely behind, being recommended for certification to ISO 9001, our Quality Management Standard, in April 2019 following an audit by SGS.

We also had a 3-day recertification audit for our Information Security Management System (ISO 27001) in May. The Sourcing and e-Enablement teams in Companies House and the Bridgend Stores team were audited across the 3 days with a new audit body, British Assessment Bureau. We were successfully recommended for recertification for ISO 27001.

Our Customer Services Excellence reassessment was completed during 10-13 June, again with a new certification body, so look out in the next Newsletter for news of this.

The last of the year’s external audits will be completed in August 2019, with full reviews of the Quality Management (ISO 9001) and Occupational Health & Safety Management Systems (OHSAS 18001).

The conclusion of the ISO external audit programme will allow the Procurement Teams to review all findings in line with our Business Planning framework and to identify and prioritise those areas where we can make improvements and add value to the teams and, ultimately, to make the service the best we can for our customers.



ISO In-House Auditor Training

In addition to contributing to our external audits, Procurement Services staff have been getting involved in the ISO in-house Audits for our Integrated Management System (IMS) for ISO certifications.

The latest contingent of ISO in-house auditors was trained in May. Trainees will be completing their first ISO audits in Quarter 2. This will allow staff to upskill, gaining a better understanding of the interactions between the different areas of Procurement Services and allowing them to identify best practice examples which could benefit their internal team, as well as identifying opportunities for improvement, process streamlining and further interaction between teams. In return, our ISO in-house auditors receive full training, recognition within their PADRs and opportunities to engage and collaborate with other teams to drive continual improvement forward.

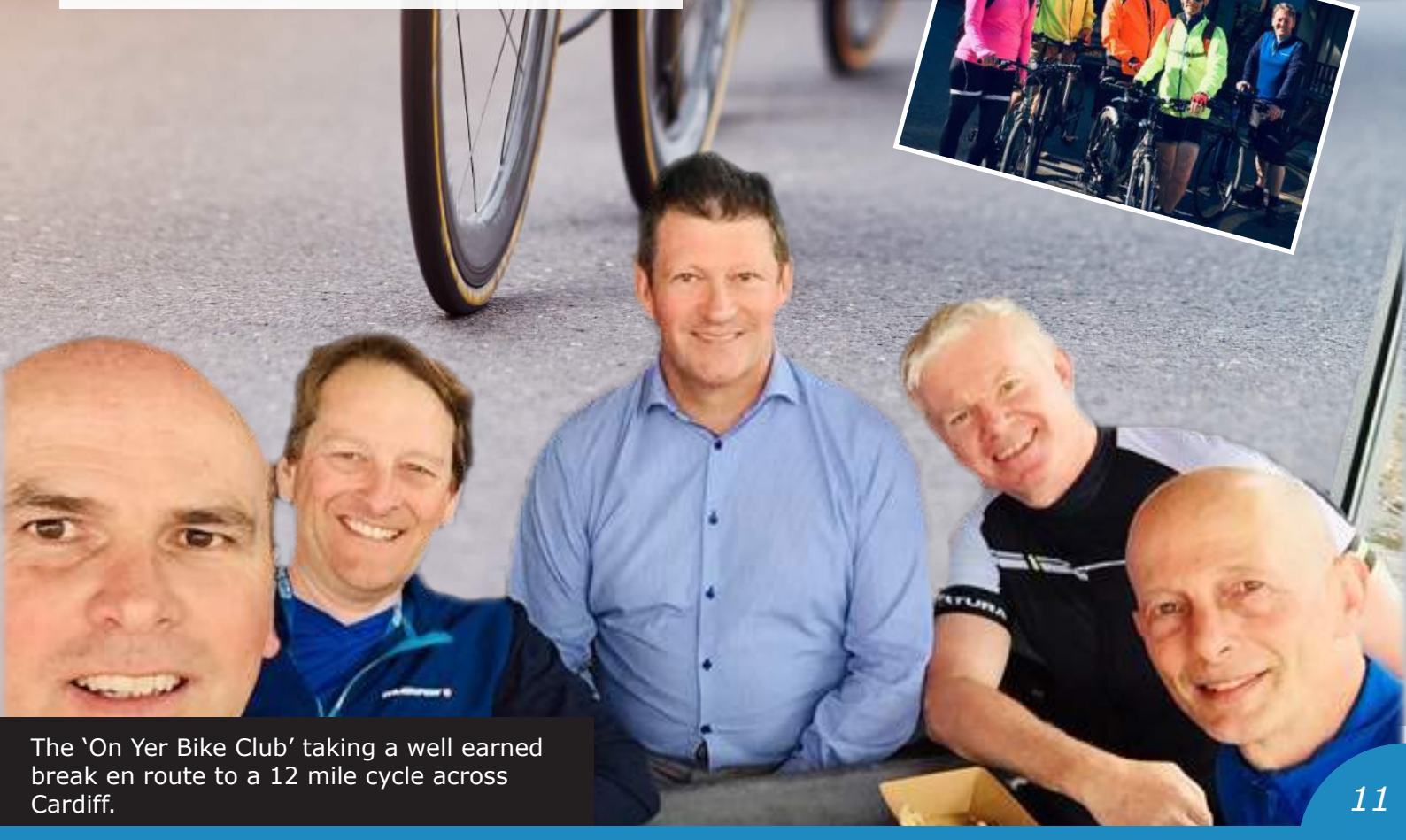

Colleague Gildas Griffiths, Operational Services Improvement Manager & Westpoint Site Manager, Health Courier Services, is organising a Snowdon challenge for Macmillan in memory of his father, journalist and historian Gwyn Griffiths, to thank the charity for supporting his family.

Author, award-winning translator and historian Gwyn, who lived in Pontypridd, died in April last year aged 77, just months after being diagnosed with incurable cancer.

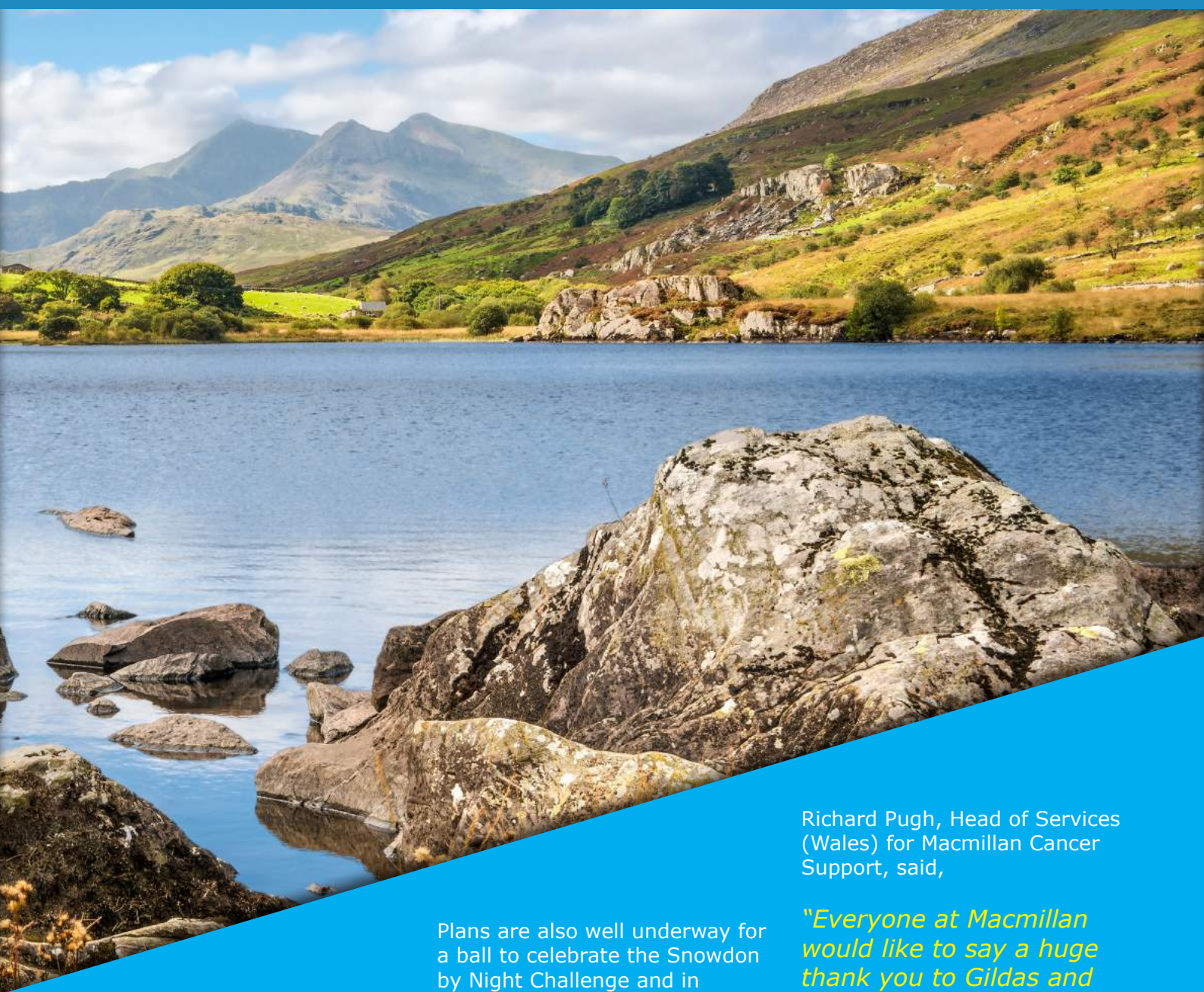
In his memory, one of Gwyn's four children, Gildas, is organising a Snowdon By Night challenge in April 2020, and a ball at Cardiff's Copthorne Hotel on 19 June 2020. Both events will raise funds for Macmillan Cancer Support. Gildas is building a team of colleagues, family and friends to take on Mount Snowdon by night on 25 April next year.

Gildas said,

"My dad was an inspirational man, an amazing father, husband, historian, journalist and a vital link between Wales and Brittany. Macmillan Cancer Support provided incredible emotional and physical support during his illness. He was diagnosed in January 2018 with cancer which had metastasized [spread], his condition deteriorated quickly and this was very difficult for his family to see."

"Whilst being extremely strong minded, his mobility eventually became restricted and Macmillan were able to provide equipment at home to help him and his family because he wanted to stay at home. Macmillan nurses provided dignified and compassionate care, which was helpful. He was eventually admitted to Pontypridd Cottage Hospital, where he passed away peacefully."





Gildas is no stranger to fundraising challenges, as he has previously organised and taken on the Three Peaks Challenge for charities, and the team taking on Snowdon By Night will be able to enjoy the spectacular sunrise when they've climbed Wales's highest peak.

Father-of-two Gildas said,

"The event is designed to get colleagues, friends and family together and enjoy the spectacular scenery in Snowdonia, but also get fit, shed a few pounds and improve our general well-being and to smash any previous fundraising targets!"

Plans are also well underway for a ball to celebrate the Snowdon by Night Challenge and in memory of Gwyn, who wrote for 'Y Cymro' and worked for BBC Wales during his celebrated career, which also including writing, translating and editing 25 publications.

Gildas is also looking for donations for a charity raffle which will be held on the night.

The conference offers delegates practical advice from experts within the legal sector on how to maximise the value of their accreditation.

The Lexcel Legal Practice Quality Mark is the Law Society's Lexcel accreditation, indicating quality in relation to legal practice management standards and client care.

Legal & Risk Business Support Manager, Lowenna Taylor, deputised for Director Anne-Louise Ferguson and participated as a guest speaker on the panel discussion '*how to make Lexcel work for your business*'.

Lowenna provided an overview of how Lexcel works for Legal & Risk Services within NHS Wales and provided advice and practical examples of how the accreditation can be helpful to in-house teams and how all firms can use the standard to help with organisational growth and change.

Other panel sessions included hot topics in practice management, how to avoid repeat non-compliances and lessons learnt from Lexcel version 6.1.

What is Lexcel?

Lexcel is an accreditation indicating quality in relation to legal practice management standards. It was introduced by The Law Society of England and Wales in 1998. Until 2010, the Lexcel standard was attainable by law firms and in-house legal departments in England and Wales. Since September 2010, Lexcel accreditation has been attainable by any law firm or in-house legal department in any jurisdiction in the world. The worldwide scheme continues to be administered by the Law Society of England and Wales.

The benefits of achieving Lexcel accreditation include:

- ✓ Improved marketability and competitive advantage

Our Charity Work: Sponsored Bike Ride Raised Funds for Macmillan Cancer Support

Nic Cowley from Sourcing has just completed another sponsored bike ride to raise funds for Macmillan Cancer Support. His latest attempt at holding back the inevitable tide of age was the Wales Dragon Ride on 9 June 2019. Owing to a family illness, Nic did the shorter 100km route rather than the planned 153km. This route still had three very challenging climbs which required subtle friction prevention after 4.5 hours in the saddle.
