Dear Colleague

The National Assembly for Wales Culture, Welsh Language and Communications Committee has recently published its report following scrutiny of the National Health Service (Welsh Language in Primary Care Services) (Miscellaneous Amendments) (Wales) Regulations 2019.

The report makes eight recommendations to Welsh Government including a recommendation that:

'The Welsh Government should undertake a communications campaign to educate independent primary care providers of their new duties. This campaign should promote the opportunities for Welsh speakers as a result of these duties and clarify the extent to which service providers are required to converse in Welsh'

The Minister for Health and Social Services will respond in due course to the recommendations. In the meantime we felt it would be helpful to explain the importance of the duties and how they will promote further awareness and support development of Welsh language in delivering health services.

The Welsh Government is in the early stages of developing a Welsh Language Toolkit for the Primary Care Sector. The toolkit is aimed at supporting the sector and promoting the Welsh language by following the principles of the More than Just Words strategic framework and the 'Active Officer'. We thought in light of the recommendations in the Committee report that it would be useful to develop a Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ) fact sheet to support and raise awareness in the interim as we work on the development of the toolkit.

The FAQ fact sheet is attached at Annex A.
