Welsh Language Survey

As part of ongoing work to assess how the needs of Welsh speaking patients are being met, the Welsh Government and BMA Cymru Wales are conducting a short survey about Welsh language capability in GP practices across Wales. This will provide information to help future planning and support for practices as new Welsh language duties and regulations have come into force.

This brief survey, which is being sent to every GP practice in Wales, seeks to confirm which services, training and information practices currently provide in both English and Welsh. It should take around 10 minutes to complete and can be accessed through the attached link.
